## **Article 19. Student Rights and Responsibilities**

- 1. A University student has the right to:
- (A) To receive quality education and to participate in scientific research; B) use material-technical base, library, information and other means;
- C) obtain comprehensive information on educational programs at the University and request syllabuses for courses;
- D) to demand a fair assessment of knowledge and to file adverse test results as prescribed;
- E) receive qualified advice from the authorized person on the timing and format of educational programs, educational disciplines and examinations;
- F) periodically evaluate the work of the academic staff / student services.
- G) Repeat the course of study through self-financing within the semester credits established for the main timeframe program within the timeframe set for the educational program. In this case, the student will be given a better result when evaluating the course;
- H) enjoy other rights conferred by law. 2. University students are required to:
- A) to comply with University regulations and disciplinary rules;
- B) abide by and comply with the terms of the student contract;
- C) adhere to the deadlines set by the university for the educational process;
- D) pay the semester tuition fee within the timeframe for administrative registration and undergraduate academic registration; E) adhere to generally accepted norms of ethics and conduct;
- F) take care of the property owned by the University;
- 3. The following shall be considered inappropriate and unethical for the student:
- A) plagiarism quoting another's opinion or work without the author's reference;
- B) systematic smoking of tobacco, except for specially designed

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Will be confirmed by the document created by the authorized person;

- C) gross and unethical treatment, violence and abuse of students, academic, administrative and support staff;
- (D) Attempts to make an assessment by threatening, physically or psychologically threatening, cheating, cheating, or other inappropriate means or conduct.
